Freedom Walk

Oklahoma's Freedom Walk, on the fifth anniversary of the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks, is today at 5:30 p.m. with a ceremony at the Oklahoma City National Memorial and Museum. The walk supports the men and women fighting the war on terrorism around the world. Survivors, family members and rescue workers from Oklahoma City have been invited to lead the walk.

Inspired by the America Supports You Freedom Walk held in Washington, D.C., last year, the 2006 Oklahoma City Freedom Walk will be a 1.17-mile march through the heart of downtown and will travel through Bricktown to the east side of the AT&T Bricktown Ballpark. Participants will see a performance by country act The Great Divide and special guest Luke Stricklin.

The purpose of the walk, which is open to

the general public as participants, is to provide Oklahomans an opportunity to pay public tribute to lives lost in the terrorist acts, make a renewed commitment to freedom and honor America's military veterans, police officer and fire heroes.
